SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT MINOR REQUIREMENTS

Minor in Sustainable Development

Students of any discipline who are interested in helping solve the triple bottom line challenge of their generation: economic well-being, environmental protection, and social inclusion, are invited to join with like-minded students to collaborate in devising and implementing solutions to real-world challenges of Sustainable Development (SDEV).

The minor in SDEV consists of a minimum of at least 15 hours of study that includes a combination of core courses and approved electives. Minors are required to complete a total of 8 core credits (SDEV 010, SDEV 201 and SDEV 202) or (SDEV 010 and SDEV 203). The remaining 7 credits may be selected from the Additional Course Electives listed below or in consultation with the Program Director.

Completion of ECO 1 is a prerequisite for enrollment in the SDEV minor, except for those for whom the program director waives the prerequisite.
